What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the **Pathfinder KiwiSaver Growth Fund** has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Pathfinder Asset Management Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

The Fund is an ethical portfolio with a higher exposure to growth assets and a lower exposure to income assets. This Fund's value is likely to fluctuate more than the Pathfinder KiwiSaver Balanced Fund or Pathfinder KiwiSaver Conservative Fund.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Pathfinder KiwiSaver Growth Fund



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

The Market Index is the Morningstar® Target Allocation Index[™]: Growth Multisector for New Zealand, non-New Zealand Fixed Interest 100% hedged to NZD. The index is gross of dividends and tax except for International Equities and International Listed Properties, which are gross of dividends after deducting the tax withheld.

The market index changed on 1 December 2021. The previous index was a weighted composite benchmark index as described in the Fund Update ("How has the fund performed") for the quarter ended 30 September 2021. The new index is independently administered and widely used to compare funds in New Zealand. The manager also considers that the new market index is more appropriate for measuring changes in the market in relation to returns on the assets that the Fund invests in. As a result, the market index annual return is calculated using the previous market index for the period since Fund inception to 30 November 2021 and the new market index from December 2021.

Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.


Example of how this applies to an investor

Tara had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Tara received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$679 (that is 6.79% of her initial \$10,000). Tara also paid \$27 in other charges. This gives Tara a total return after fees, charges and tax of \$593 for the year.

The top 10 investments make up 23.45% of the net asset value of the fund.

Currency hedging: Changes in the value of the NZ dollar relative to other currencies can have a big impact on your investment over the long term. The target currency hedging is 0% of non-NZD equity exposure and 100% of non-NZD fixed interest exposure (actual hedging level at 31 March 2022 was 49.05% of the foreign currency exposure (this will change over time)). Total unhedged foreign exposure is 28.64% of the net asset value of the Fund at 31 March 2022 (this will change over time).

Notes

- 1) Risk indicator: This risk indicator is not a guarantee of a fund's future performance. Market index returns as well as the fund's actual returns have been used to fill in the risk indicator because the risk indicator is calculated using returns data for the five-year period ending on 31 March 2022. Market index returns have therefore been used for the period from 1 April 2017 to 23 July 2019 when the fund was not in existence or available for investors, and actual fund returns have been used since then. As a result of those returns being used, the risk indicator may provide a less reliable indicator of the potential future volatility of the fund. While risk indicators are usually relatively stable, they do shift from time to time. The risk indicator will continue to be updated in future fund updates. Due to the change in market index from 1 December 2021 (see "How has the fund performed" for a description of this change) the risk indicator reduced from "5" to "4" for the quarter ended 31 December 2021. As more of the fund's actual returns are used to calculate the risk indicator over time, the effect of the change in market index on the risk indicator will decrease. However, as already noted, any use of market index returns may result in a less reliable indicator of potential future volatility of the fund.
- 2) Actual Investment Mix- Other: Other Assets include investments known as 'impact investments', 'private equity', carbon credits, and 'private credit'. This category also includes unlisted property, such as direct ownership in property or ownership of property companies that are not listed on a stock exchange.
