

Fund Update for: the Pathfinder Managed Investment Scheme Pathfinder Global Responsibility Fund Quarter ended 30 June 2020

What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the **Pathfinder Global Responsibility Fund** has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Pathfinder Asset Management Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

The fund invests in global equites that satisfy Pathfinder's socially responsible screening. It achieves this by investing in Pathfinder's wholesale Responsible Investment Fund which targets a portfolio of 250 stocks.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Pathfinder Global Responsibility Fund



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.



Example of how this applies to an investor**

Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.


Angela had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Angela received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$488 (that is 4.88% of her initial \$10,000). Angela did not pay any other charges. This gives Angela a total return after tax of \$554 for the year.

Notes
